
# THANKS TO OLGA MARTINEZ MANAGER OF WAL-MART

#### **News from the US Navy and the Coast Guard**

USS Bataan's (LHD 5) engineering material office, Charles W. Vandiver, a 30-year veteran, was promoted 29 December to one of the most experienced pay grades in the Navy, chief warrant officer (CWO) 5. He reported aboard Bataan in April of 2008, on his second stint in the Navy after retiring in late 2006.

The Secretary of the Navy, Donald C. Winter announced 8 January that the next Virginia-class attack submarine will be named in honor of recently retired US Sen. John Warner of Virginia. Warner retired 3 January 2009 after 30 years service in the US Senate.

The executive officer (XO) of Naval Submarine Support Center received the Bronze Star Medal for nearly a year of service as an individual augmentee (IA) at Forward Operating Base (FOB) Shield, located in Sadr City, Baghdad, Iraq. Lt. Cmdr. James Hoch was presented by Rear Adm. Bruce Grooms, commander, Submarine Group 2 during a ceremony 12 December at Naval Submarine Support Center Norfolk.

USCG Diamondback (WPB87370) was commissioned in Miami on 17 January 2009. The Honorable Mel Martinez, US Senate, was the Keynote Speaker. The Sponsor was Mrs. Kitty Martinez. LTJG Alan Grosse will be the Commanding Officer.
