

Maritime and Sea Service News



WASHINGTON—Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Secretary Janet Napolitano applauded President Obama's intent to nominate Vice Admiral Robert J. Papp, Jr., as Commandant of the U.S. Coast Guard. If confirmed by the U.S. Senate, Vice Admiral Papp would relieve Admiral Thad Allen in May 2010. Papp currently serves as Commander of the Coast Guard Atlantic Area (LANTAREA) and Defense Force East—functioning as the operational commander for all Coast Guard missions within the eastern half of the world. Prior to assuming command of LANTAREA, he served at the Chief of Staff of the Coast Guard in Washington. Papp graduated from the U.S. Coast Guard Academy and holds a master's in national security and strategic studies from the U.S. Naval War College and a master's in management from Salve Regina College.



HOMESTEAD—The October 2000 terrorist assault on the USS *Cole* killed 17 sailors and injured 39, among them Petty Officer 3rd Class Johann Gokool of Homestead, an electronic warfare technician. On December 23, 2009, relatives say Gokool died in his bed, apparently during one of the violent panic attacks that had plagued him since the incident. On October 12, 2000, as the *Cole* refueled at the port of Aden, Yemen, terrorists rammed it with an explosives-filled boat, tearing a 40-foot gash in the hull and triggering deadly fires. Gokool was in the mess hall and fell four stories into an engineering room, where he lay unconscious. He was flown to a military hospital in Germany, then to the Naval Medical Center Portsmouth in Virginia where doctors discovered that gangrene was spreading up his left leg and Johann made the decision to take the leg off The family planned to take his ashes to Arlington National Cemetery, where the *Cole* victims lie in a special section



The USS Independence (LCS 2) was commissioned on January 16th in Mobile, Alabama. The Independence is the second littoral combat ship delivered to the Navy, and the first LCS of the General Dynamics variant. LCS is a new breed of U.S. Navy warship with versatile warfighting capabilities, capable of open-ocean operation, but optimized for littoral, or coastal, missions. The LCS class is designed from the keel up to deliver efficient capability, capacity, and flexibility to the warfighter. Independence, a high-speed aluminum trimaran, is designed to defeat asymmetric "anti-access" threats such as mines, quiet diesel submarines and fast surface craft. The 417-foot Independence is outfitted with reconfigurable payloads, called mission packages, which can be changed out quickly. These mission packages focus on three mission areas: mine counter measures, surface warfare and anti-submarine warfare.

IMPORTANT CHANGES IN 2010

The thing I like the most about my job is: My division and I boost the crew's morale by ensuring our services are open and available for the crew.



Community Affiliates

Many men and women serving on the front lines in Iraq and Afghanistan have no families or do not receive mail and care packages from home. The Broward County Council and Operation Homefront are working together in an effort to get as many "care packages" as possible mailed to our troops deployed to the Middle East. We have received many donations of hygiene items, comfort items, OTC medications and snack foods from outside sources and this has allowed us to fill up many "care packages".

YOU CAN HELP! While we have donations of the items in the care packages, the cost of mailing them is beyond the Council's budget. The cost to mail each "care package" using an APO/FPO flat rate box is \$12.50 per box (rates increased on January 4th). We could possibly mail hundreds of boxes if our members help us with the mailing costs. The following is an email received by Al & Shelly Stein from the CO of Lima Company which will be receiving some of the care packages:

Thank you for your service and the work you are now doing to support our Marines. I am the CO for Lima Company and we are 306 Marines and Sailors strong in Now Zad, Helmand Province, Afghanistan. We have a unique situation here in Now Zad. Up until now Now Zad city has been abandoned due to the fighting that took place in 2006. Recently we did an operation to clear the Now Zad Valley of Taliban and are in the process of rebuilding and repopulating the city. We already have a school established that instructs 150 students a day, 25 of which are girls and a lot of shops opening in our market. I have attached a picture of my Marines on patrol.
