September is Sea Cadet Month—The U S Naval Sea Cadet Corps is a U S Navy-based organization that teaches youth between the ages of 13 – 17 about the sea -going military services, community service, citizenship, and an understanding of discipline and teamwork. Another version of the Sea Cadets Corps is the Navy League Cadet Corps which exists for youth between the ages of 11 – 13. The Naval Sea Cadets Corps was founded in 1958 by the Navy League of the United States at the request of the Department of the Navy. In 1962, it was chartered under Title 36 of the United States Code as a non-profit youth organization with an emphasis towards the sea-going services of the United States. The law was amended in 1974 to allow female participation.

## **RESOLVE MARINE**

Our Community Affiliate, Resolve Marine Group, deployed its fleet of vessels to serve the pollution prevention and oil skimming operations in the Gulf of Mexico. Resolve operated out of its Theodore, Alabama port after the explosion on the Deepwater Horizon oil rig on April 20, Resolve Marine Group was initially deployed to support the firefighting effort on the Deepwater Horizon rig and deployed more than 50 vessels and floating assets in support of the oil spill skimming and clean-up activities, as a subcontractor to BP. Resolve's primary focus was the initial logistical planning for the skimming operations, the containment, management and removal of surface crude oil, and the prevention of oil reaching beaches and infiltrating wetland areas on the Gulf coast in Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and Florida. Resolve crews were engaged in a variety of operations including: deployment of vessels, laying boom, positioning skimming equipment in specific spill locations, transporting collected crude oil to BP facilities, and decontaminating vessels employed in the spill areas prior to their return to protected ports and harbors. More than 100 Resolve personnel and subcontractors worked 24 hours a day, 7 days a week on the clean-up



# **MEMBER RON PERKINS**



In July 2010, Seafarers' House announced the appointment of Deacon Ronald G. Perkins to the position of Chaplain for Seafarers' House. An upstate New York native, Deacon Perkins earned an RN degree at Marcy State Hospital School of Nursing affiliated with Utica College of Syracuse

University and spent the early years of his career as a US Navy Nurse Corps Officer. While in the Navy, Perkins served on surgical teams deployed aboard naval vessels and was the medical regulating officer for the evacuation of Saigon. After leaving the Navy, his work in the health care field included serving as VP of Patient Care Services at Saint Francis Medical Center in Monroe, Louisiana and later, as VP of American Healthcorp, Inc. in Nashville, Tennessee. In 1987, Perkins founded his own company, Health Advantage, Inc. In 1994 Perkins joined American Document Management as Chairman, taking on the financial and corporate relations management for this technology company now based in Fort Lauderdale.

Because of his deep-seated faith and his calling to the maritime ministry, Deacon Perkins took on the mission of Seafarers' House service to the maritime community as a new vocation. Ordained to the Diaconate in August 2006, Perkins has served at both Ecclesia Christi and Our Lady of Hope Western Orthodox Catholic Church as well as volunteering as chaplain with Seafarers' House and the Fort Lauderdale and Lauderhill Police Departments. Perkins is a Certified Law Enforcement Chaplain and Critical Incident Stress Manager.


## CARE PACKAGES FOR DEPLOYED MARINES


# LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS

JAC Navy Family Readiness Group

The U.S. European Command's Joint Analysis Center (JAC) is located about 60 miles north of London at RAF Molesworth. There are approximately 350 Naval personnel at the location and their primary function is to process, analyze and consolidate data to produce fused intelligence information on 77 countries across, Europe, Africa and the Middle East. They support mission planning and operations by U.S., Allied and NATO commanders during peace, crisis and war. Mission commanders and decision-makers at all levels rely on information produced at the JAC. Personnel from all four U.S. military services are assigned to the Joint Analysis Center and contribute to the intelligence mission.

Unlike large bases, such as Norfolk or San Diego, when young sailors and their families report to this facility, one of the first things they learn is that there isn't any mess hall. Many of these young sailors do not own cars and are therefore limited as where they can purchase food. The prices at the base convenience store and onbase pizza restaurant are expensive relative to the salaries paid to enlisted sailors. In an attempt to give the new arrivals time to get acclimated, the JAC Navy Family Support Group provides each sailor with a basket containing basic food items. In an average year, 50 new sailors arrive at the JAC and even with the usual fund raisers the FSG is always looking for ways to raise additional funds for this endeavor. In addition to the food baskets, they also send care packages to forward deployed sailors who were previously assigned to the JAC.

While visiting the installation, council members Al and Shelly Stein learned about this program and made an unsolicited donation on behalf of the Council.

# COUNCIL PARTNERS WITH OPERATION HOMEFRONT FOR SCHOOL SUPPLIES

For the past several years, the Navy League has partnered with Operation Homefront and the Dollar Tree Stores in the Back to School Brigade. The program helps military families get their children ready to go back to school by collecting new school supplies for children of all ages. This program helps save military families a huge expense as they prepare their children for a new school year. In 2009, Operation Homefront served nearly 20,000 children with a full backpack and countless other military children with supplies preparing them for a successful school year. From July 11 through August 2, 2010, Dollar Tree stores nationwide collected back to school supplies for military children. Navy Leaguers registered to pick up supplies at designated Dollar Tree Stores and bring them to local military locations. In early August, Council President George Reeves picked up over 600 items and delivered them to Lt James Neville, Commanding Officer, Marine Reserve Center and LCDR Brett Bormann, Commanding Officer, Naval Operations Support Center. Board members Al and Shelly Stein picked up over 300 items and delivered them to Coast Guard Station Fort Lauderdale
