Looking ahead to March, we will be returning to the STAR Center on Thursday, March 12th for dinner and a tour of the outstanding facilities used to train American's merchant mariners led by BCNL member Graeme Holman. This may be your only chance to "navigate" a big ship in to and out of Port Everglades or one of the many other seaports the STAR Center has loaded into their simula-I'm looking forward to a great turntors. THE STAR CENTER

For those who may not be familiar with the STAR Center, the following information was taken from their website (www.star-center.com).

STAR Center is a not-for-profit maritime training school that is the top choice of inland and ocean-going professional mariners throughout the world. Opening in 1983 in Toledo, Ohio, we expanded to our current location in Dania Beach in 1986, consolidating all training there in October 2008. After extensive facility improvements, we opened for business with the world's first 360° field-of-view Full Mission bridge simulator, and a second 247° (subsequently upgraded to 270°) field of view bridge simulator, in 1993. We now offer more U.S. Coast Guard and other approved courses than any other simulation training center. Our courses meet USCG, STCW, and IMO Model requirements, as well as many additional courses designed by our in-house curriculum development team to meet company-specific training requirements.

The Commemorative Air Force (CAF) Red Tail Squadron, America's tribute to the Tuskegee Airmen, is bringing its RISE ABOVE Traveling Exhibit mobile theater and WWII P-51C Mustang aircraft to the Wings Over Miami Air Museum March 5 through 8. This is a unique opportunity for all ages to learn about the Tuskegee Airmen - America's first black military pilots and their support personnel - in a unique and interactive way. The general public may tour the museum at special rates during the week; however, the P51 Mustang will be there only on the weekend. The Museum is open Saturday March 7 and Sunday March 8 from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. for everyone to experience the mobile theater and get an up close look at the CAF Red Tail Squadron's restored P-51C Mustang on static display. The signature aircraft of the Tuskegee Airmen in WWII, the P-51C Mustang is a rare treat for spectators because it is one of only a few like it still flying today.

Seafarers' House was honored Seafaras er Advocate of the Year during Lloyd's List North America Maritime Awards held in mid -February at Houston's Houstonian Hotel, Club Seafarers' and Spa. House Executive Director Lesley Warrick accepted before the award a crowd of more than 300 marine professionals. The prestigious awards are held each year to recognize the best and bright-

est in North American shipping, according to Lloyd's List Editor Richard Meade. A panel of judges that included chairmen and residents of the maritime industry's leading governing bodies and trade associations selected this year's winners. The Seafarer's Advocate Award recognizes individuals, organizations or groups that have delivered benchmark services or had other occasions to safeguard and promote the welfare of mariners in North American waters.

Seafarers' House at Port Everglades is a nonprofit organization supported by the faith-based community as well as by labor, business and civic leaders with a mission "to offer refuge, resources, renewal and respect to the maritime community through multi-faith service." Open throughout the year, Seafarers' House is a safe, friendly place where cruise and cargo ship mariners can connect with their families, relax, or get emergency assistance if needed. With the help of its supporters and volunteers, Seafarers' House offers many services including low cost international phone calls, free transportation, Internet access, counseling services, liaison with authorities as well as recreational facilities.

CONGRESSWOMAN FRANKEL

On January 23, 2015, Representative Lois Frankel was sworn in as a Member of the U.S. House of Representatives for the 114th Congress. Congresswoman Frankel is a lawyer who has been the United States Representative for Florida's 22nd congressional district since 2013. She is a member of the Democratic Party. The swearing-in ceremony took place at the Broward County Courthouse and included a performance by the Gay Men's Chorus of South Florida and Presentation of Colors by the Fort Lauderdale Police Department Honor Guard. Dr. Fred Lippman of Nova Southeastern University welcomed guests before an invocation was given by Rabbi Adam Watstein of Temple B'Nai Aviv. The Oath of Office was administered by U.S. District Judge Beth Bloom. "It is a privilege to work on behalf of the South Florida community I love alongside my neighboring colleagues who are outstanding allies," said Congresswoman Frankel. "I look forward to our continued work together to keep social security and Medicare secure, stand up for our veterans, and grow bigger paychecks for hardworking families."

COMMISSIONING

On January 24, 2015, The Coast Guard commissioned William Trump, the 11th fast response cutter and fifth to be based in Key West. Rear Adm. John Korn, commander of the Coast Guard's Seventh District, presided over the commissioning ceremony. Korn, who previously oversaw the Coast Guard's acquisition programs, spoke of the importance of the new FRCs to the execution of Coast Guard missions. The cutter was named after William Trump, who participated in the occupation of Tunisia, the invasion of Sicily and the landings at Salerno before earning the Silver Star during the invasion of Normandy in 1944. Trump risked mines and heavy fire to anchor a safety line on Omaha Beach for the 200 troops on his vessel to follow. He retired as a chief petty officer and died in 2009. Trump's daughter, Colette Eddy, served as the ship's sponsor. Coast Guard Cutter William Trump is 154-feet long, has a beam of 25 -feet, and a maximum sustained speed of more than 28 knots. The William Trump is armed with a stabilized 25mm machine-gun mount and four crew -served .50-caliber machine guns. Lt. Jared Harlow is the commanding officer of the William Trump (in photo below being saluted by RADM Korn).

SEA SERVICE NEWS



Successfully putting a damaged AV-8B Harrier down on an amphibious assault ship at sea last year earned the Marine Corps Air Medal for Capt. William Mahoney, a Harrier pilot with Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron 263 (Reinforced) aboard the USS Bataan (our Coun-

cil's adopted ship). While in the U.S. 6th Fleet area of operation with the 22nd Marine Expeditionary Unit in June, Mahoney realized he had a malfunctioning landing gear shortly after taking off from the ship. The failure left him with the options of either attempting a risky landing or ditching the aircraft into the sea. The ship boasted a crash cradle, a unique piece of equipment built to the height of a Harrier's nose and, for Mahoney, presented a way to bring the roughly 30,000pound aircraft down aboard the Bataan. Mahoney used the Harrier's ability to take off and land vertically and descended upon the cradle. His position obscured any view of the emergency equipment and he had to land sight unseen. For his actions, Mahoney received the Air Medal from Col. William Dunn, who commanded the MEU, on February 12. Dunn praised Mahoney for saving the aircraft.

Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Jonathan Greenert presented the U.S. Navy Meritorious Unit Commendation on February 20 to Capt. Jeff Hamilton, commanding officer of the Royal Canadian Navy frigate HMCS Toronto (FFH 333). in Halifax. Nova

Scotia, Canada. A non-U.S. naval force receiving a U.S. Navy unit decoration is a rarity; this event marking the fifth occurrence of such a decoration in the last 45 years. Returning from their deployment, the crew of the Toronto was selected to receive the prestigious award due to their continued support of Combined Task Force 150. The Halifax-class frigate significantly disrupted the flow of drugs, criminal and terrorist activities in the U.S. Central Command area of responsibility.



U.S. Coast Guard Commandant Adm. Paul Zukunft delivered the 2015 State of the Coast Guard Address at U.S. Coast Guard Headquarters in Washington, D.C.,

The commandant outlined how on February 24. America's Coast Guard will meet today's challenges while preparing for complexities that remain ahead. The commandant stated that the service's increasing demands in the areas of drug interdiction, Arctic operations, cybersecurity in the maritime domain and transportation of energy resources are converging with its daily operations and limiting the Coast Guard's ability to respond to major contingencies. "I am committed to ensuring that our budget priorities are driven by a Coast Guard strategy aligned with national priorities to ensure our people have the platforms they need to serve the nation now and into the future," said Zukunft.
