Stationed at the Coast Guard Station on Miami Beach, Paul Clark is our fourth adopted cutter there joining with the Bernard Webber, Margaret Norvell and the Robert Yered. A new ship, the USS Paul Ignatius (DDG 117), will be commissioned in Port Everglades next year. The Paul Ignatius is a guided missile destroyer and was christened in April. The ship is named in honor of the former Secretary of the Navy. Meetings will begin soon to plan for the commissioning. As this will be a large event, many organizations and individuals will be involved and there will be opportunities to volunteer.

Coming in October will be Oktoberfest. As in past years, our Council will partner with the Fort Lauderdale Council for this fun event. There will be a change in venue this year as it will be at Old Heidelberg Restaurant in Fort Lauderdale. Come and join us for an enjoyable evening.

PROCLAMATION

The Coast Guard announced in April that BMCM Mathew J. Coppola, who at the time was the Officer-in-Charge of the USCGC Gannet, was selected as the Thirteenth Silver (Enlisted) Ancient Mariner. The Ancient Mariner title recognizes the officer and enlisted person with the earliest designation as a permanent cutterman and requires a minimum of ten years of sea time. The award recipients must personify and uphold the core values of honor, respect and devotion to duty, along with the professionalism and leadership associated with long service at sea. The Council reached out to Broward County Commissioner Chip LaMarca and requested that BMCM Coppola's achievement be recognized. On September 25, Broward County Board of County Commissioners presented him with a proclamation naming the day as "Master Chief Coppola Silver Ancient Mariner Day". Many Coast Guard personnel and several Navy Leaguers were on hand on September 25 to join in honoring Coppola, currently Officer in Charge of the USCGC Manatee, on his selection. Broward County Commissioner Chip LaMarca presented the proclamation. Congratulations to BMCM Coppola and thanks to the Broward County Commissioners' Office for ensuring that his achievement was recognized.

Captain Passarelli graduated from the U. S. Coast Guard Academy with a Bachelors of Science degree with Honors in Civil Engineering and was commissioned an Ensign in 1992. He has served aboard six cutters during his career, commanding three

of them while conducting Coast Guard operations around the globe. He has additionally served in a number of staff positions including two assignments in the Coast Guard Headquarters' Chief Financial officer's organization. CAPT Passarelli holds a Master of Science degree in Operations Research from George Mason University and a Masters of Business Administration (MBA) from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). In his current capacity as the Chief of Staff of the Seventh Coast Guard District, he is second in command of the largest and busiest District in the Coast Guard, spanning 1.8 million square miles, five states and territories, and 31 sovereign nations. He leads six Sectors, four Air Stations, 20 Rescue Stations and 42 ships with a workforce of 4.000 active duty, 1.000 reserves, 800 civilians and 4.500 Auxiliarists.




ADOPTED UNITS

On September 20, Council President Larry Ott and Commanding Officer LCDR Kristopher Ensley, signed the official Unit Adoption Certificate making the US Coast Guard Cutter Paul Clark WPC-1106 the Council's fourth adopted cutter.

The Paul Clark is the sixth Sentinel-class cutter and is homeported in Miami. The cutter was commissioned on August 24, 2013. The vessel is named after Paul Leaman Clark, who served as a fireman in the United States Coast Guard during World War II. Clark was staffing a landing craft during a large assault on a beach in French North Africa when the craft's two other crew members were wounded by a Luftwaffe fighter. Clark took command of the craft, took the wounded crew members to a Navy ship for medical care and then returned to his duties as a beachmaster, directing disembarkation activity. (from Wikipedia)

Council President Ott also recognized the achievements of the Paul Clark's Enlisted Person of the Quarter and Enlisted Person of the Year. Larry presented the Enlisted Person of the Quarter award to FN Derrick E. Knox (shown in top photo with Larry and CO Ensley) and the Enlisted Person of the Year award to MK1 Jason S. Hudson (shown in bottom photo with Larry and CO Ensley). A donation to the cutter's MWR fund was also made.





Reference is often made in The Helmsman to our "adopted unit" but do you know what that means? The objective of adopting a unit is to provide continuing support to that unit. Adoption implies a commitment of continuing support. The Sea Service unit being adopted benefits from the adoption by having their crew members see that civilians care enough about what they do to thank them and provide individual recognition for their accomplishments. The unit's leadership can often develop personal relationships with members of the community. The Council benefits by developing working relationships with the unit's leadership and enhanced access to local Sea Service functions and personnel.

Coast Guard Station Fort Lauderdale – located in Dr. Von D. Mizell-Eula Johnson State Park, Dania Beach

Coast Guard TACLET South – located in Opa Locka.

USCG Cutter Paul Clark – homeported in Miami

USCG Cutter Margaret Norvell – homeported in Miami

USCG Cutter Bernard C. Webber – homeported in Miami

USCG Cutter Robert Yered - homeported in Miami

We recognize the achievements of the sailors/enlisted persons of the quarter and sailors/enlisted persons of the year at all of the above units. We are able to have a more personal relationship with our local Coast Guard units. Annually we host an Easter Egg Hunt/ BBQ at no cost for Coast Guard personnel and their families. We also annually host a holiday party for Coast Guard personnel and their spouse/significant other. Our local Coast Guard personnel attend many of our dinner socials and often serve as guest speakers.

LOCAL DUES

Local dues notices will be sent out in the near future. The Council depends on these funds which directly support Council activities. Examples of Council activities:

Webber, USCGC Robert Yered, Coast Guard Station Fort Lauderdale, Aids to Navigation (ANT) and TACLET South.

Support of Sea Cadets: Zeus Division of the Naval Sea Cadets are provided financial support. Teddy Roosevelt medals are presented to outstanding cadets.


Support of Fleet Week: Council members volunteer and are able to participate at various events which include welcome reception, ship visits, junior officers' party, and golf outing. Council hosts a junior officers' party.

Support of our adopted JROTC units: Cooper City High School, Flanagan High School, NOVA High School, Stranahan High School, and Taravella High School. The Navy League's Teddy Roosevelt medal is presented to outstanding junior cadets at each school.

Support of visiting military vessels: Council greets each visiting military vessel and hosts All Hands Parties for the crews. Ship tours and onboard receptions are arranged when possible.

Dinner Socials: Council provides guest speakers who will share information on issues affecting the Sea Services. This is a great opportunity to interact with other Navy Leaguers.

The Council only receives a small rebate from your national dues but is able to utilize 100% of the local dues you pay. Please help the Council continue with the above activities and more by sending payment of local dues when you receive the statement.



Port Everglades has been chosen for the commissioning of the USS Paul Ignatius (DDG 117). A meeting was recently held to begin the process of forming a Commissioning Committee. Mary Anne President/ Grav. Executive Director of Broward Navy Days became Chair. Oscar Romano of the Fort

Lauderdale Council and Joe Giambrone of our Council will be Co-Chairs. The commissioning is tentatively scheduled for July 27, 2019

CDR Robby Trotter, Senior Chief Jasmine Williams and Chief Warrant Officer Sara Goodale from the USS Paul Ignatius were on hand for the meeting. CDR Trotter answered many questions and provided us with their ideas and wish lists. Many at the meeting were able to share their ideas, requests and experience with previous commissionings. David Anderson, Commissioning Director, was also in attendance and the Committee will work closely with him during the planning stages.

USS Paul Ignatius is named for Paul Ignatius who served as Secretary of the Navy under President Lyndon Johnson from 1967 to 1969. Ignatius had previously served as a commissioned lieutenant in the Navy during World War II.

USS Paul Ignatius will be the 67th Arleigh Burke-class destroyer, the fifth of 14 ships currently under contract for the DDG 51 program. The 9,200 ton vessel is 509 feet in length, has a waterline beam of 59 feet, and a navigational draft of 31 feet. Four gas turbine engines will power the ship to speeds in excess of 30 knots. DDG 51 destroyers are warships that provide multi-mission offensive and defensive capabilities. They can operate independently or as part of carrier strike groups, surface action groups, amphibious ready groups and underway replenishment groups. DDG 113 and follow-on DDGs are being built with integrated air and missile defense (IAMD) capability.

The USS Paul Ignatius was christened April 8 at Huntington Ingalls Industries Shipbuilding in Pascagoula, Mississippi. Paul Ignatius attended the ceremony, and his wife Nancy, the ship's sponsor, officially christened the ship. Paul and Nancy Ignatius have been married nearly 70 years and have four children together. *(photo and excerpts of story from The Maritime Executive)*

US COAST GUARD CUTTER PAUL CLARK



The crew of the USCGC Paul Clark joined Council President Larry Ott and Past President Glenn Wiltshire after the Unit Adoption Certificate was signed on September 20, 2018.
