GUEST SPEAKER



Captain Todd J Cooper Merchant Marine Deck Officer Commander, US Navy Reserve Port Everglades Pilot

Captain Cooper graduated Cum Laude from Maine Maritime Academy in 1997 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Marine Transportation, a USCG Unlimited 3rd Officer License and a commission as an Ensign in the United States Navy Reserve. He is a native of Pemberton, New Jersey. Upon graduation Todd sailed as an Able Bodied Seaman on the heavy-lift vessel, Strong Virginian. He later went to Hawaii on the cruise ship SS Independence as a 3rd Officer. Todd continued his career at sea advancing his license to 2nd Officer and Chief Officer working on a variety of ships including, oil and product tankers, roll-on roll-off vessels, and government owned military support vessels. Todd earned his Unlimited Master's license at the age of 29. His first command as Master (Captain) started in 2006 aboard the crane ship, SS Cornhusker State. Some of his achievements as Master included JLOTS in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba 2009 and Operation Unified Response 2010 in Haiti after the devastating earthquake. It was here that Todd was awarded the Merchant Marine Medal for Outstanding Achievement awarded by the United States Maritime Administration. In 2012, after achieving the top score on a highly competitive exam, Todd was appointed by the State of Florida as a Port Everglades Harbor Pilot in Fort Lauderdale, where he resides with his family. Todd is married to the former Heather Leigh Madrak and together they have three boys, Erik, Gavin, and Brendan.

CDR Cooper's recently retired from the naval reserve after 21 years serving as a Strategic Sealift Officer. This was a very unique career because it required CDR Cooper to maintain an active USCG License and to work in the US Maritime Industry. The Strategic Sealift Officer Reserve Group is the only virtual reserve group in the US Navy. His active duty training has included various training schools; Port Ops in Mayport, FL; Portsmouth Naval Shipyard in Kittery, ME; the US Maritime Administration in Washington, DC and Norfolk, VA; and at Little Creek Amphibious Base in VA.




FLEET WEEK 2019

AWARDS

The Navy League awards committees has announced the winners of the Council Awards, Mackie Awards and Ship Adoption Awards. Thanks to the efforts of our Council's Board of Directors and the participation of its members, the Council was rated Outstanding for 2018. The rating is based on the Council's support of our Sea Service personnel and their families, support of our youth groups, interaction with our legislators, and education of the public on the mission of the Navy League.

The Donald M. Mackie Awards were established in 1964 to encourage more effective communication between Navy Leaguers. The award honors excellence in all areas of communication including newsletter, website and social media communication. Award levels are Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze and do not take the size of the Council in consideration. The Council received Mackie Awards in all three areas. The Council's newsletter, The Helmsman, was rated Gold. Its editor is Marianne Giambrone. The Council's Facebook page was rated Bronze. The page is managed by Joe Giambrone and Marianne Giambrone. The Council's website was rated Bronze. It is managed by Wayne McLaren.

New for consideration for 2018 was Sea Service Adoption Excellence Awards awarded to Councils who demonstrated the strongest commitment to direct support of Sea Service units through a robust adoption program. The award is inclusive of support to all types of adopted Sea Service Units, including youth groups. Councils are divided into three judging categories based upon the size of the council. Our Council was given an award under the small size council (up to 125 members).

Second Vice President Marianne Giambrone will accept the awards on behalf of the Council at the National Convention being held June 19-22 in Norfolk Virginia. Board Member and National Treasurer Joe Giambrone will also be attending the Convention.

These awards are confirmation that the Council is completing its mission of providing support to our Sea Service units. We hope that Council members will continue to participate in our events and make financial contributions, including local dues, that will allow us to provide additional support to the Sea Service units we have already adopted as well as adopt more units in the future.

FREE ADMISSION

With Abraham Lincoln as the flagship, deployed strike group assets include staffs, ships and aircraft of Carrier Strike Group 12, Destroyer Squadron 2, USS Leyte Gulf and Carrier Air Wing 7 as well as Álvaro de Bazán -class frigate ESPS Méndez Núñez.

John Pinto, a Navajo Code Talker in World War II who became one of the nation's longest serving Native American elected officials as a New Mexico state senator, has died. He was 94. After serving as a Code Talker — a group of radio men who translated American coordinates and messages into an indecipherable code based on the Navajo language -Pinto had to take an English test four times before he was finally admitted into the University of New Mexico's College of Education. He graduated with a bachelor's in elementary education at 39, and eventually earned his master's, becoming a teacher and a truancy officer in Gallup. Pinto delved into politics to address the needs of impoverished indigenous populations. The Democrat won a seat in state Senate in 1976 as one of the state's first Native American senators.
