Captain Shawn "Max" Koch assumed command at US Coast Guard Air Station Miami in June 2019. Prior to assuming command, he served as the Chief of Incident Management for the Seventh Coast Guard District. He oversees search and rescue (SAR), aviation, pollution/HAZMAT response, command center operations, emergency management and implement of the National Incident Management System.

Captain Koch previously served as chief of Maritime and Arctic/Senior Intel Analyst at NORAD/US Northern Command, Ops Officer at CGAS Atlantic City/Director of Ops at National Capital Region Air Defense Facility and Chief of Intel Ops at CG Operations Command. He was the MH-68A Branch Chief at Helicopter Interdiction Tactical Squadron (HITROL-10), and a duty standing HH-65A pilot at Group/Air Station North Bend. As a cutterman, he was Lead Boarding Officer on CGCs DECISIVE and RESOLUTE. He has also served as an Oregon Sheriff's deputy, an aviation gunner course instructor and is current an EMT.

A native of central Wisconsin, Captain Koch graduated from the Coast Guard Academy in 1995 with a BS in management. He has earned an undergrad certificate in law enforcement, an MBA, and a MS in strategic intel (MSSI) with concentration in counter-terrorism from National Defense College. He is also a graduate of the Naval War College (JPME-I) and Joint and Combined Warfighting School (JPME-II).

Captain Koch is married to the former Trisha McKinnon of Alberta Canada and they have three children.

SEA-AIR-SPACE

The 2020 Sea-Air-Space exposition will take place from April 6 – 8 at the Gaylord National Resort and Convention Center in National Harbor Maryland. It is the largest maritime expo in the United States. In 2019, there were over 337 exhibitors and 15,000 attendees including 186 flag officers. Sea-Air-Space brings the U.S. defense industry and key military decision-makers together for three days of informative educational sessions, important policy discussions and a dynamic exhibit hall floor.

Now in its fifth year is the return of the Sea-Air-Space STEM Expo. The STEM Expo is geared toward 5th through 12th grade students. It is a free event aimed at inspiring and empowering students interested in science, technology, engineering and math careers. Students and parents can enjoy interactive STEM workshops, hands-on demonstrations, STEM career information, networking opportunities and more. The Expo will take place on April 5 from 12:00 – 4:00 PM at the Gaylord National Resort and Convention Center.

SEA SERVICE NEWS



A keel-laying ceremony was held February 12 for the future USNS Cherokee Nation (T-ATS 7), the second ship of the Navy's Navajo class of towing, salvage and rescue vessels.

The ceremony was held near Gulf Island Shipyard at the Houma Terrebonne Civic Center. In attendance to authenticate the keel was Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, Chuck Hoskin Jr., and the ship's sponsor and deputy speaker of the Cherokee Nation Tribal Council, Victoria Mitchell Vazquez. The Navajo-class will provide ocean-going tug, salvage and rescue capabilities to support fleet operations. The current capabilities are provided by three T-ATF 166 and two T-ARS 50 class ships, several of which will reach the end of their expected service lives later this year. Navajoclass ships will be capable of towing U.S. Navy ships and will have 6.000 square feet of deck space for embarked systems. The platform will be 263 feet long, have a beam of 59 feet and can carry a load of nearly 2,000 tons. (story and photo from Seapowermagazine.org)



The Gearing-class destroyer Orleck has made its home in Lake Charles for the past decade but may soon join the Jacksonville Naval Museum. The Jacksonville Historic Naval Ship Association hopes to

have the Orleck as its main attraction for museum-goers and ship enthusiasts everywhere. Details are still being worked out. The ship came to Lake Charles in May of 2010, and was open to the public by April of 2011. Orleck will be towed to Port Arthur where it will be dry-docked for a good cleaning, some hull repairs, other minor repairs, a fresh coat of haze gray paint and whatever other superficial needs necessary to be berthed in Jacksonville. The ship is being prepared internally by volunteers that are packaging artifacts and securing documents among other things. (story and photo from NavyTimes.com)
