### The Coast Guard's Next Icebreaker Has A Name

The nation's first sea-going heavy icebreaker in more than 45 years will be named Sentinel -- a nod to its predecessors as well as future missions in the polar regions, Coast Guard Commandant Adm. Karl Schultz said Thursday.

In his fourth and final "State of the Coast Guard" address delivered at Coast Guard Air Station Clearwater, Florida, Schultz announced the name and said design work continues on the \$745.9 million vessel, expected to be delivered in 2025.

### Saying goodbye to nearly 50 years of Naval history

Kitty Hawk, a ship that served from Vietnam through the second Iraq war was the Navy's last commissioned conventional-powered aircraft carrier. It operated for 48 years before it was decommissioned in 2009.

### **PCS Fort Lauderdale**

PASCAGOULA, Miss. - The U.S. Navy has accepted delivery of its future Amphibious Transport Dock ship, USS Fort Lauderdale (LPD 28), March 11.

Delivery signifies the ship's official transfer from the shipbuilder to the Navy. Shortly after the Navy accepts delivery pre-commissioning unit (PCU) Sailors will move aboard the ship to begin training and outfitting the ship while the shipyard completes work aboard the Fort Lauderdale.

What is a TACLET? TACLETs are a United States Coast Guard specialized force that carry out maritime interdiction, security and counter narcotics operations.

# Advocating on Behalf of the Sea Services

Advocacy is a main pillar of the Navy League's mission. As a nonprofit organization, we are able to mobilize our grassroots membership to get to the heart of the issues that matter to the sea services, both on Capitol Hill and in our local communities.

### Don't cut Tanker Support Program

If the United States needed to engage in sustained foreign operations, a possibility made all the more likely by our renewed focus on great power competition, our forces would not have access to the refueling fleet required to accommodate both domestic trade needs and global military operations. This problem has only increased in recent years, and there is no indication that it will change absent significant legislative action by Congress.

### **Energizing American Shipbuilding**

America and the international community are caught in the grips of a global shipping crisis and a global energy crisis. There is one bipartisan bill currently introduced in Congress which could help America to navigate its way through both of these disasters. This is the Energizing American Shipbuilding Act, which will substantially expand the U.S. shipbuilding industrial base and the U.S. Flag Fleet by giving American vessels a larger role in the export of Liquefied Natural Gas.

### **Defend Jones Act Jobs**

The Jones Act— the law that requires that vessels moving cargo between U.S. ports be American built, American owned and American crewed—is fundamental to our domestic maritime industry. You no doubt know that there was significant turnover in Congress in the last election and many new members need to learn about the Jones Act, its importance to America and it relevance to their constituents. This becomes even more critical when one considers that there are well-funded groups working hard today, advocating for repeal of the Jones Act.

### Divest to Invest – 2022

#### Navy Fleet Would Shrink Further under Navy 2023 Decommissioning Plan



LCS Freedom - under the most recent proposal from the Navy, all Freedom class ships would be scraped. One of which is less than two years old.

Normally the number of new U.S. Navy ships requested for the next a new fiscal year garners the most attention of reporters, but this time it was the number of ships the Navy is seeking to decommission that drew the most attention.

Under the Future Years Defense Plan, the size of the Navy's battle force would shrink from 298 today to 280 in fiscal 2027. Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Michael Gilday has advocated divesting in order to invest, and this budget supports that concept.

During the Navy Department's March 28 fiscal 2023 budget briefing at the Pentagon, Rear Adm. John Gumbleton, deputy assistant secretary of the Navy for Budget, said the Navy is requesting the retirement of 24 ships, compared with the construction of nine bat-
