Jacksonville, FL. - The Navy League of the United States is an organization comprised of more than 178 councils worldwide. These councils have membership of over 28,000. Each year they conduct a national convention, typically on alternating coasts. This year the site was Jacksonville, FL.

Once again BCNL was recognized with all 3 of the Mackie awards. As you may recall the Mackie awards recognize Councils for their communication efforts.

This year we have the special honor of being awarded the Platinum level award for our newsletter the Helmsman. Platinum is the highest level recognition offered.

We also did very well with the other two Mackie categories, Web Site and Social Media. In both cases we were awarded Gold level awards, which is the second highest category.

It has been a very busy time since our last newsletter. Board Secretary Shelley Beck represented



us at the Navy League National Convention in early June in Jacksonville. In addition to being reelected as the South Florida Area President, she attended the annual awards luncheon and was able to accept the three awards our Council received this year for our Newsletter- Platinum - the

highest award; Website - Gold - 2nd highest award; and Social Media - Gold - 2nd highest award. This wouldn't have occurred without the hard work of our Newsletter Editor Wayne McLaren who also keeps our web site current, and Shelley's efforts to post articles of interest to our social media accounts.

We also bid farewell to one of our adopted units, the USCGC MANOWAR, that has been moved to Fort Pierce, FL to take the place of the USCGC FLYING FISH as part of the force realignment announced by the USCG last year. We wish the crew the best as they move to other units.

We had a good turnout for our dinner meeting on June 12th at Tropical Acres to listen to RADM Brendan McPherson, USCG, the Director of Operations (J-3) for U.S. Southern Command. RADM McPherson showed a brand-new video highlighting the many missions of SOUTHCOM and the critical role it plays in regional security in Latin America and spoke to us about the wide-ranging responsibilities of SOUTHCOM in their Area of Responsibility. RADM McPherson and his wife have been friends of the Council for many years, so it was great that they could join us.

On June 20th, I represented the Council at the Change of Command at USCG Base Miami Beach, where we bid farewell to CAPT Roger Omenhiser, who retired after 24 years of service, and welcomed CAPT Clay McKinney. While Base Miami Beach is not one of our adopted units, they are a critical unit as they provide logistics support for most of the units in District Seven, and our long time Council friend BMCM Becky Wyness remains their Command Master Chief.

On June 27th, Shelley, Lawrence Denmark, and I represented the Council at the USCG Air Station Miami Change of Command where we bid Captain Eric Smith farewell as he turned over command to incoming Captain Aaron Ortenzio, and witnessed CAPT Smith's retirement from the Coast Guard after 36 years of service. I presented a Council plaque to CAPT Smith recognizing his service and thanking him for his support of the Navy League and our Council. We all wish he and his fiancé Rachel well. We will also be representing the Council at the upcoming TACLET South and Seventh District Changes of Command in July. We wish all of those retiring or transferring this summer safe travels.

As most know, the Council takes a break for the summer, and our next event will be our annual joint meeting with the Fort Lauderdale Council at the Lauderdale Yacht Club on September 17th to hear the summer training reports from multiple Sea Cadets from the USS Fort Lauderdale Division. The flyer attached to this newsletter has more details on how to RSVP. This is always a great event, so I'm looking for a good turnout of our members. In October, we will once again be heading back to Old Heidelberg for our annual Oktoberfest gathering. In November, we may go back to the STAR Center again since that is always a popular event. Will have more details on that as the dates gets closer.

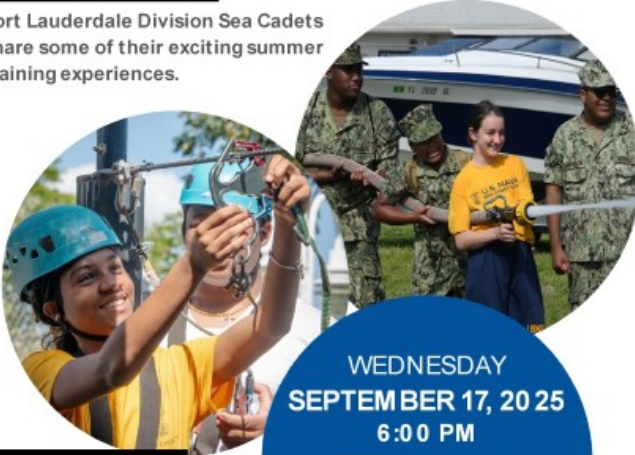

New NLUS President

Aside for the numerous meetings, events, activities which took place at the convention there were also a number of officials whom were elected. One of these was a new president, Larry G. Salter, Captain, USN (Retired), to a two-year term as the 53rd National President

Salter will begin his tenure as the 53rd National President of the Navy League immediately. A dedicated member of the organization for more than two decades, Salter brings deep experience in both military and civilian leadership, having held numerous national and local positions within the Navy League and across the private sector. Salter currently serves on the Navy League's Board of Directors and most recently held the roles of National President Elect (2024–2025), National Senior Vice President (2022–2024), National Vice President (2021–2022), and Region President (2019–2021). From 2003 to 2024, he also served continuously as a board member and officer for his local Navy League council, the Bremerton-Olympic Peninsula Council.

A retired U.S. Navy Captain, Salter's final active-duty assignment was as Commanding Officer of Naval Air Station Whidbey Island. Following his military career, he transitioned to the defense industry, where he has spent more than 23 years in key leadership roles spanning business development, federal contracting, and project management. His post-service career includes serving as Director of Marketing for a high-tech firm, Executive Director of West Coast operations for a \$300 million defense company, and founder of LGS Solutions, a consulting firm focused on federal government opportunities. His consulting work has supported clients in space, nuclear energy, and advanced manufacturing, among other sectors.

Salter's commitment to public service extends beyond his professional work. He has served on multiple corporate and nonprofit boards, including appointments by the Lieutenant Governor to the Washington State Leadership Board and the Association of Washington Generals, as well as serving on the Puget Sound Naval Bases Association.

He holds an MBA, a Master of Science in Supply Chain Management, and an Executive Leadership Certificate from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). He is also a certified Project Management Professional (PMP).

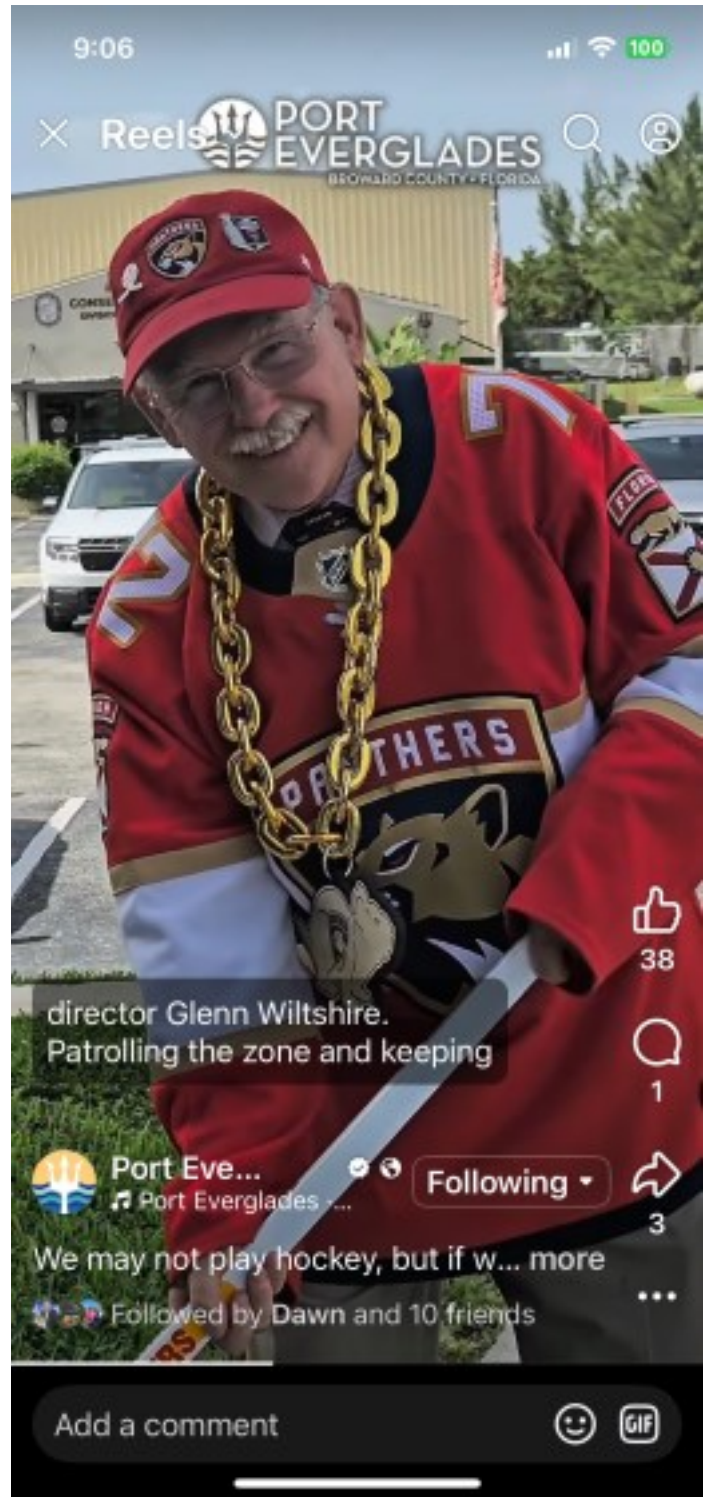
